Will AMEA power build a solar photovoltaic plant in Djibouti?

Emirati independent power producer (IPP) AMEA Power has signed agreements to build a solar photovoltaic plant in Djibouti. With a capacity of 30 MWp,the construction of the solar plant will be done in the framework of a public-private partnership (PPP).

The solar plant is the country's first IPP project and will be developed under a BOOT model. "The Sovereign Fund of Djibouti (FSD) will be joining the project before financial close as a minority shareholder," AMEA Power said, without providing additional details.

Amea Power has secured a power purchase agreement (PPA) for a 25 MW solar-plus-storage projectin Djibouti. It will be the country's first independent power producer (IPP) project and is now in development under a build-own-operate and transfer (BOOT) framework.

What does AMEA power do in Djibouti?

AMEA Power will develop the project in partnership with the Sovereign Wealth Fund of Djibouti (FSD). The electricity produced will be sold to Djibouti's public utility Électricité de Djibouti (EDD), under a long-term power purchase agreement.

The project will be the first solar Independent Power Project (IPP) in Djibouti and will be located in Grand Bara, south of Djibouti City. The solar project is being fully developed by AMEA Power under a Build-Own-Operate and Transfer (BOOT) model.



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The photovoltaic solar cells will emit the sunlight and convert the gathered solar energy into power energy, which is then stored in the solar battery. At night, the lamp will switch on automatically then consumes the solar power that is stored in the battery. During the first 5 hours of the night, the light will work at average lumens brightness.
