### **Energy storage installations Serbia**

How many MW of battery storage will be developed in Serbia?

Up to 200 MWof battery storage will be developed across the sites. Image: Ministry of Mining and Energy, Tanjug Plans for 1 GW of new solar in Serbia are set to go ahead after the signing of an implementation agreement.

#### Does Serbia have a solar project?

The contract is the latest in a line of solar projects backed by Serbia's Ministry of Mining and Energy this year, which includes plans for a 1 GW solar panel factory and another 500 MW of solar. Figures from the International Renewable Energy Agency state Serbia had deployed a total 137 MW of solar by the end of last year.

#### How many MW of solar is installed in Serbia?

The government has formed a working group to organize the tender, select successful bids, and negotiate with the chosen strategic partner. According to the Association of Renewable Energy Sources of Serbia, the country has installed around 50 MWof solar. However, that figure is not exact, as there is no official registry at this stage.

#### How much electricity does Serbia get from fossil fuels?

Serbia currently gets more than 60% of its electricity from fossil fuels. The contract is the latest in a line of solar projects backed by Serbia's Ministry of Mining and Energy this year, which includes plans for a 1 GW solar panel factory and another 500 MW of solar.

#### What is Serbia's largest solar plant?

In April, Serbia switched on its largest solar plant, the 9.9 MW DeLasol PV projectin the Lapovo, central Serbia. Serbia currently aims to deploy 8.3 GW of PV by 2024, according to a draft plan released by the government last year.

#### Is solar a good option for Serbia?

A statement published on the Serbian government's website says solar is the most optimal solution quickly reach large capacities from green sources, without burdening and endangering the stability of the transmission network. The Ministry of Mining and Energy in Serbia has decided to launch an official tender on September 3, 2021 to offer subsidies for solar for self-consumption. It will offer subsidies for the installation of solar systems.

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Greece has officially launched its third tender for battery energy storage capacity, aiming to allocate 200 MW of projects eligible for subsidies of up to 200,000 euros per MWh.This tender marks the final phase of Greece's ambitious 1 GW program, which is designed to support the development of standalone energy storage installations across the country.

As of the first half of 2023, the world added 27.3 GWh of installed energy storage capacity on the utility-scale power generation side plus the C& I sector and 7.3 GWh in the residential sector, totaling 34.6 GW, equaling 80% of the 44 GWh addition last year. Despite a global installation boom, regional markets develop at varying paces.

Mid last year, the government embarked on a lookout for strategic partners who would install the facilities, including 1,000 MWac (1,200 MWdc) of solar plants and at least 200 MW of battery storage.
