How much solar energy will be generated in 2030?

Reaching an annual solar PV generation level of approximately 8300TWh in 2030, in alignment with the Net Zero Scenario, up from the current 1300TWh, will require annual average generation growth of around 26% during 2023-2030.

Why is energy output a function of solar power?

Energy output is a function of power (installed capacity) multiplied by the time of generation. Energy generation is therefore a function of how much solar capacity is installed. This interactive chart shows installed solar capacity across the world. This interactive chart shows the share of primary energy that comes from solar power.

What is the global solar power tracker?

The Global Solar Power Tracker is a worldwide dataset of utility-scale solar photovoltaic (PV) and solar thermal facilities. It covers all operating solar farm phases with capacities of 1 megawatt (MW) or more and all announced, pre-construction, construction, and shelved projects with capacities greater than 20 MW.

How many GW of solar PV will be installed in 2030?

Continuous support for all PV segments will be needed for annual solar PV capacity additions to increase to about 800GW, in order to reach the more than 6000 GW of total installed capacity in 2030 envisaged in the NZE Scenario. Distributed and utility-scale PV need to be developed in parallel, depending on each country's potential and needs.

What is total solar power installed capacity?

Total solar (on- and off-grid) electricity installed capacity, measured in gigawatts. This includes solar photovoltaic and concentrated solar power. IRENA (2024) - processed by Our World in Data

What is the global solar PV market like in 2022?

The solar PV market is dominated by crystalline silicon technology, for which the production process consists of four main steps: In 2022, global solar PV manufacturing capacity increased by over 70% to reach 450 GW for polysilicon and up to 640 GW for modules, with China accounting for more than 95% of new facilities throughout the supply chain.

Wind power was once again the most important source of electricity in 2023, contributing 139.8 terawatt hours (TWh) or 32% to public net electricity generation. This was 14.1% higher than the previous year's ...
