In 1994,it divested from its generation holdings on the larger island of Trinidad and now purchases energy from three Independent Power Producers (IPPs): the Power Generation Company of Trinidad and Tobago,which purchased the former T&TEC-operated plants and presently controls 1,386 megawatts (MW) of gas-fired capacity across

xToco (North-East Trinidad): xDesignated wind energy pilot project site with a capacity of 2 x 1.4 MW turbines; xBenefits from two nearby substations, three 33 kV overhead lines, a communication tower, as well as the connection cable with Tobago. xLa Brea (South-West Trinidad): xLocation of TGU plant (combined cycle; total capacity: 720 MW);
